IOM's role in migration research



Key contributions

- In 2022, 305 new publications were added to the IOM Publications Platform.
- Following its publication in December 2021, the <u>World Migration Report 2022</u> has been fully translated into <u>French</u>, <u>Spanish</u>, <u>Chinese</u>, <u>Russian</u> with key chapters also available in <u>German</u> and <u>Swahili</u>. Translations into more languages are ongoing.
- Three toolkits that draw on the World Migration Report, including the <u>Education Toolkit</u>, the <u>Fact-Checkers' Toolkit</u> and the <u>Policy Toolkit</u>, have been developed to support and enhance access to key migration data and research for a range of audiences, including educators, fact-checkers and policy officials.
- Publications on current migration trends, policies and practices in the <u>Migration Research</u>
 <u>Series</u> and the scientific journal <u>International Migration</u> as well as other research publications such as on the <u>impacts of COVID-19 on migration and migrants from a gender perspective</u>.
- The <u>Gender and Migration Research Policy Action Lab GenMig</u>, a new initiative grounded in the continuing need to improve gender equality throughout the migration cycle by leveraging research for gender-responsive policy and programmatic responses.
- Research and analysis on the impacts of COVID-19 on migration and mobility with the publication of <u>COVID-19 Analytical Snapshots</u> and <u>short think pieces</u> by IOM's Migration Research and Publishing High-Level Advisers.

World Migration Fact-Checkers' Toolkit


The Fact-Checkers' Toolkit is designed to help fact-checkers around the world to address myths and misinformation about migration.

World Migration Report Design Awards



The <u>WMR Interactive Platform</u> was recently recognized in the <u>2022 iNOVA Awards</u>, winning gold in the non-profit organizations category. The WMR Interactive Platform was also recognized by the <u>2022 Questar Awards</u>, winning gold in the interactive annual report and non-profit organizations categories, in addition to being nominated for the <u>World Summit on the Information Society (WSIS) prizes for 2022.</u>

In 2021 the WMR Interactive Platform won the silver and bronze awards in the microsite and non-profit organizations categories of the <u>2021 iNOVA Awards</u>. The WMR 2020 was also recognized in the <u>2021 International Annual Report Design Awards</u> (IADA), winning gold in the online category for the interactive platform and silver for the PDF version of the report.


