

RETURN OF UNDOCUMENTED AFGHANS

WEEKLY SITUATION REPORT 14-20 MAY 2017

Return from Pakistan

A total of 4.564 undocumented Afghans spontaneously returned or were deported from Pakistan through the Turkham border (Nangarhar province) border crossing from 14-20 May 2017, according to the Border Monitoring Team of the Directorate of Refugees and Repatriation (DoRR).

Of the total returnees, 4,535 were spontaneous returnees in family groups and 29 were deported individuals. This is a 3% increase from the previous week and brings the total number of undocumented Afghans returnees from Pakistan since 1 January 2017 to 59,985.

IOM provided post-arrival assistance to 98% of undocumented Afghan returnees from Pakistan (4,471 individuals), including 1,055 single parents and 15 special cases. The assistance provided includes meals, accommodation, Non-Food Items (NFIs), onward transportation and referral services, as well as support from partners (see Annex 1).

IOM's Deputy Director General, Ambassador Laura Thompson visited the Turkham border crossing together with the Humanitarian Coordinator, the IOM Chief of Mission, the Assistant Representative for UNHCR and donor counterparts from the EU and Switzerland, to inaugurate a substantial expansion of the IOM Turkham Transit Center in Afghanistan's Nangarhar province for undocumented Afghan returnees from Pakistan on Saturday, 20 May 2017.

Border Closures

The Spin Boldak/Chaman border closed on 05 May due to cross border fighting between Afghan and Pakistani security forces in the area. Media reports that at least 42 lives have been lost as a result of the hostilities. Government representatives from both sides are presently in negotiations however the border remains closed as of 20 May 2017.

Situation Overview

IOM is responding to a substantial increase in the return of undocumented Afghans from Pakistan and Iran. Since 1 January 2017, over 193,000 undocumented Afghans have returned due to diverse push factors, including deteriorating protection space in Pakistan. Most of those returning have lived outside of Afghanistan for decades, and will need support from the government and humanitarian actors both on arrival and as they seek to reintegrate.

As the rate of return is influenced by a number of political, security and other related factors both in Afghanistan and neighboring countries, another surge in returns could occur at any time. IOM estimates that approximately 600,000 undocumented Afghans could return from Pakistan and Iran in 2017, and is working to scale up its support to returnees in coordination with the Government of Afghanistan and other humanitarian partners.

Returns from Iran

A total of **5,609** undocumented Afghans spontaneously returned or were deported from Iran through the Islam Qala (Herat) and Milak (Nimroz) border crossings between 14 - 20 May, a **28% decrease** from the previous week ahead of an expected decline during the month of Ramadan. Of the total spontaneous returnees, 159 (9%) were in family groups and 1,641 (91%) were individuals. Similarly, out of the total deportees, 374 (10%) were in family groups whereas 3,435 (90%) were individuals. This brings the total number of undocumented returnees from Iran since 1 January 2017 to 133,544.

IOM provided post-arrival humanitarian assistance to **402 (7%)** undocumented Afghans deported from Iran at its Transit Centers in Herat and Nimroz, including 31 unaccompanied migrant children and 16 special cases


