Highlights

- 5,781** undocumented Afghans returned from Pakistan
- 10,148** undocumented Afghans returned from Iran
- 51,001** total returns from Pakistan since 1 January 2017
- 120,133** total returns from Iran since 1 January 2017
- 94%** of returnees from Pakistan (5,438 individuals) assisted
- 4%** of returnees from Iran (415 individuals) assisted

Returns from Pakistan

A total of **5,781** undocumented Afghans spontaneously returned or were deported from Pakistan through Torkham (Nangarhar province) and Spin Boldak (Kandahar province) border crossings from 30 April to 6 May, according to the Border Monitoring Team of the Directorate of Refugees and Repatriation (DoRR).

Of the total returnees, 5,739 were spontaneous returnees in family groups and 42 were deported individuals. This is a **2% increase** from the previous week, and brings the total number of undocumented Afghan returnees from Pakistan since 1 January 2017 to **51,001**.

IOM provided post-arrival assistance to **94%** of undocumented Afghan returnees from Pakistan (5,438 individuals), including 855 single parents and 5 special cases. The assistance provided includes meals, accommodation, Non-Food Items (NFIs), onward transportation and referral services, as well as support from partners (see Annex 1).

Situation Overview

IOM is responding to a substantial increase in the return of undocumented Afghans from Pakistan and Iran. Since 1 January 2017, over 171,000 undocumented Afghans have returned due to diverse push factors, including deteriorating protection space in Pakistan. Most of those returning have lived outside of Afghanistan for decades, and will need support from the government and humanitarian actors both on arrival and as they seek to reintegrate.

As the rate of return is influenced by a number of political, security and other related factors both in Afghanistan and neighboring countries, another surge in returns could occur at any time. IOM estimates that approximately 600,000 undocumented Afghans could return from Pakistan and Iran in 2017, and is working to scale up its support to returnees in coordination with the Government of Afghanistan and other humanitarian partners.

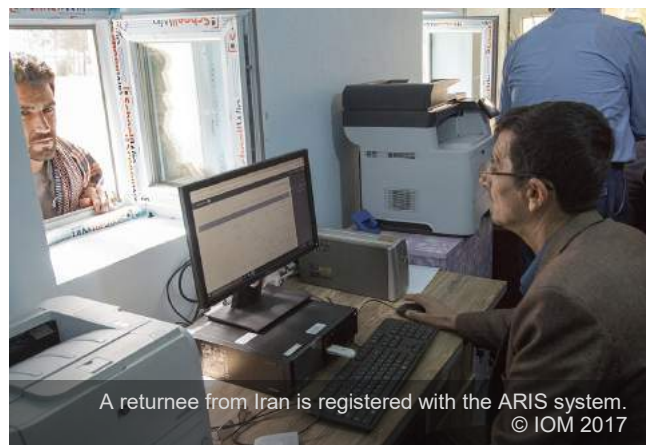

Returns from Iran

A total of **10,148** undocumented Afghans spontaneously returned or were deported from Iran through Islam Qala (Herat) and Milak (Nimroz) border crossings from 30 April to 6 May, a 14% increase from the previous week. Out of the total spontaneous returnees, 152 (5%) were in family groups and 3,023 (95%) were individuals. Similarly, out of the total deportees, 506 (7%) were in family groups whereas 6,467 (93%) were individuals. This brings the total number of undocumented returnees from Iran since 1 January 2017 to **120,133**.

IOM provided post-arrival humanitarian assistance to **415 (4%)** undocumented Afghans deported from Iran at its Transit Centers in Herat and Nimroz, including 47 unaccompanied migrant children.

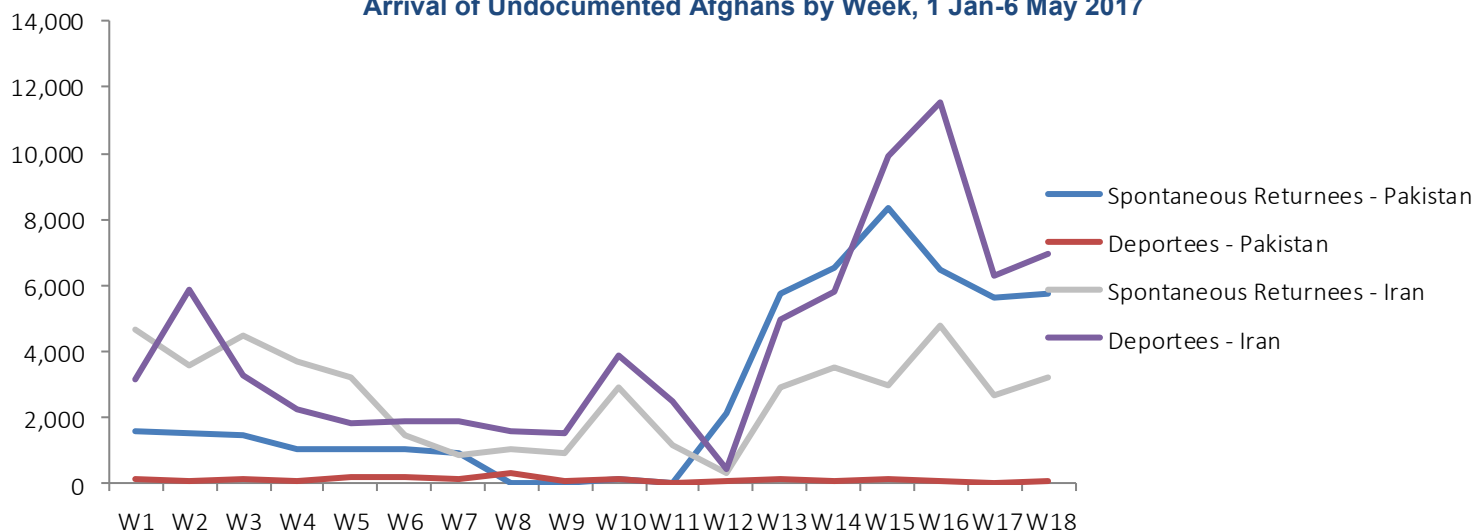
