

RETURN OF UNDOCUMENTED AFGHANS

WEEKLY SITUATION REPORT 16-22 APRIL 2017



Highlights

Returns from Pakistan

A total of **6,551** undocumented Afghans spontaneously returned or were deported from Pakistan through Torkham (Nangarhar province) and Spin Boldak (Kandahar province) border crossings from 16-22 April, according to the Border Monitoring Team of the Directorate of Refugees and Repatriation (DoRR). Of the total returnees, 6,465 were spontaneous returnees in family groups and 86 were deported individuals. This is a **22% decrease** from the previous week, and brings the total number of undocumented Afghan returnees from Pakistan since 1 January 2017 to **39,577**.

IOM provided post-arrival assistance to **89%** of undocumented Afghan returnees from Pakistan (5,837 individuals), including 918 single parents and 7 special cases. The assistance provided includes meals, accommodation, Non-Food Items (NFIs), onward transportation and referral services, as well as support from partners (see Annex 1).

An IOM humanitarian border management expert conducted an assessment at Torkham border from 18-19 April.



Situation Overview

IOM is responding to a substantial increase in the return of undocumented Afghans from Pakistan and Iran. Since 1 January 2017, over 140,000 undocumented Afghans have returned due to diverse push factors, including deteriorating protection space in Pakistan. Most of those returning have lived outside of Afghanistan for decades, and will need support from the government and humanitarian actors both on arrival and as they seek to reintegrate.

As the rate of return is influenced by a number of political, security and other related factors both in Afghanistan and neighboring countries, another surge in returns could occur at any time. IOM estimates that approximately 600,000 undocumented Afghans could return from Pakistan and Iran in 2017, and is working to scale up its support to returnees in coordination with the Government of Afghanistan and other humanitarian partners.

Returns from Iran

A total of **16,323** undocumented Afghans spontaneously returned or were deported from Iran from 16-22 April, all of them through Milak border in Nimroz province. This is a **27% increase** from the previous week. Islam Qala border remains closed for undocumented returns due to damage from flooding in February. Out of the total spontaneous returnees, 278 (6%) were in family groups and 4,519 (94%) were individuals. Similarly, out of the total deportees, 536 (5%) were in family groups whereas 10,990 (95%) were individuals. This brings the total number of undocumented returnees from Iran since 1 January 2017 to **104,166**.


IOM provided post-arrival humanitarian assistance to **344 (2%)** undocumented Afghans deported from Iran at its Transit Center in Nimroz, including 30 special cases, 27 unaccompanied migrant children, 10 medical cases and 7 unaccompanied elderly.
