RETURN OF UNDOCUMENTED AFGHANS WEEKLY SITUATION REPORT 22-28 JULY 2018

Highlights

442,690 total returns from Iran and Pakistan since 01 Jan 2018

422,831 total returns from Iran since 01 Jan 2018

19,859 total returns from Pakistan since 01 Jan 2018

20,618 undocumented Afghans returned from Iran

137 undocumented Afghans returned from Pakistan

3% of returnees from Iran (633 individuals) assisted

95% of returnees from Pakistan (130 individuals) assisted

Return from Iran

A total of **20,618** undocumented Afghans spontaneously returned or were deported from Iran through the Milak (Nimroz) and Herat (Islam Qala) border crossings between 22–28 July 2018, **17% more** than in the previous week. This brings the total number of undocumented returnees from Iran since 01 January 2018 to 422,831.

Due current funding gaps, IOM was only able to provide post-arrival humanitarian assistance to **633 (3%)** undocumented Afghans deported from Iran at its Transit Centers in Nimroz and Herat, including 27 Unaccompanied Migrant Children (UMC), 46 Medical Cases (MC), 94 members of Single Parent Families (SP) 4 Single Females (SF), 6 Physical Disabled (PD), 8 Unaccompanied Elderly (UE), 64 Special Case (SC), 77 member of poor family (PF) and 1 Chronically III.

Iranian Currency in Free Fall

The devaluation of the Iranian Rial is now at an alltime record low of 1 USD=120,000 IRR, compared with 1 USD = 40,000 IRR in 2017. This, amongst other factors, has caused the Iranian economy to slow down rapidly. As Afghans in Iran primarily work in the informal economy, the demand for this type of work is drastically reduced. Further, as all Afghans typically send home the main parts of their earnings in the form of monthly remittances, the Afghan economy itself will suffer direct and immediate effects. Less money coming from working males who are instead returning home to few jobs combined with an ongoing drought and resource competition with other returnees will put additional pressures on Afghan families.

Situation Overview

Since 01 January 2018, IOM is responding to the return of over 442,000 undocumented Afghans from Pakistan and Iran. Undocumented returns from Iran in particular are seeing a massive increase of more than 200,000 in 2018 to over 402,000 total versus 187,000 in 2017. Largely driven by recent political and economic issues in Iran including massive currency devaluation. As Afghans primarily work in the informal economy in Iran the demand for this type of work is drastically reduced. Further as all Afghans typically send home their earnings in the form of monthly remittances, the Afghan economy itself, already evident in the drought affected provinces of Herat, Badghis and Ghor, is suffering direct and immediate effects.

Return from Pakistan


A total of **137** undocumented Afghans spontaneously returned or were deported from Pakistan through the Turkham (Nangarhar) and Spin Boldak (Kandahar) border crossings from 22 –28 July 2018, according to the Border Monitoring Team of the Directorate of Refugees and Repatriation (DoRR). Of the total returnees, 129 were spontaneous returnees and 8 were deported. This number marks a **83% decrease** compared to the previous week (848). The total number of undocumented Afghan returnees from Pakistan since 01 January 2018 is now 19,859. IOM provided post-arrival assistance to **95%** of undocumented Afghan returnees from Pakistan (130 individuals).
