

National Government begins Administrative Registration of Venezuelan Migrants

On April 6, the National Government began the Administrative Registration of Venezuelan Migrants (RAMV), which will go until June 8. Registration may be carried out for free in 51 municipalities and 21 departments. The information collected will be used to formulate and design a comprehensive policy for humanitarian attention, so that services offered are more appropriate, as established by Decree 542 of March 21, 2018.

Informative pamphlet and labor guidance for returning

Colombians

Based on the idea that the returning population can contribute significantly to the development of the country, taking advantage of their abilities and knowledge acquired abroad, this pamphlet informs Colombians residing abroad who wish or decide to voluntarily return about the relevant institutions, applicable norms, and steps they should take prior to their return, in order to make an objective decision based on the current context and reintegrate into their birth country. It presents information and guides returning Colombians regarding the entities and services available from the Administrative Sector of Labor (made up of the Ministry of

Labor and its associated and related entities), designed to facilitate their return and possibilities to obtain sources of income, entrepreneurship, and labor insertion, within the framework of legal benefits the Government of Colombia has established for this population.
