Highlights

- IOM launched USD 20 Million appeal for Hurricane Matthew response: USD 6.9 Million (34.5%) has been pledged of which USD 6.02 Million has been received
- A total of 110 trucks carrying 556 Mtons of NFIs and aquatabs/ORS have been dispatched by IOM to Les Cayes and Jeremie hubs
- Mixed DPC-IOM-Haitian Red Cross Teams will scale up DTM and registration activities in shelters and affected communes

Situation Overview

On the morning of Tuesday 4 October, Hurricane Matthew, the first Category 4 to hit the country in the past 52 years with winds up to 150 mph (240 km/h) barreled into southern coastal towns including Jeremie, Les Cayes, Port Salut, Dame Marie and Jacmel, causing major damage to homes, schools and other public buildings.

- 1.4 million people in need of humanitarian assistance; 2.1 million individuals have been affected (UN-OCHA)
- Estimated casualties range from 546 deaths and 438 injured according to the Directorate of Civil Protection (DPC)
- 80% of electricity network destroyed in the Southern peninsula and 90% of homes in the South and Grande Anse department have been damaged or destroyed by the Hurricane
- 141 493 individuals are temporarily residing throughout 204 evacuation shelters in Grand Anse and South Department (DPC).
- More than 3,700 suspected cases of cholera have been reported by the Government since 4 October
- 733 schools have been affected
- Important damages were reported to makeshifts tents housing returnees/deportees from the Dominican Republic in Anse-a-Pitres (Belle Anse)

IOM RESPONSE



- As of 9 November, 44,791 households have received assistance through the IOM-managed NFI pipeline while further distributions targeting another 1,244 families are ongoing.
- IOM has received 809 MT of NFIs in 22 cargo flights and 02 road transport cargos that were transported to the IOM warehouse in Port au Prince for further shipment to affected areas.
- IOM released 4,590 kg of HTH to DINEPA in Les Cayes.



IOM has received reports from field partners that certain sites had been vacated. IOM and protection actors are investigating the reasons of these movements.

In Les Cayes, the departmental authorities have reported the following three shelters to be imminently cleared out: Lycée Claudy Musseau; Ecole Nationale Dumarsais Estimé; Lycée Philippe Guerrier.

The below information regarding the residents of these shelters has been shared with the Protection Working Group for appropriate follow-up:

- Lycee Claudy Musseau: This site is housing 139 registered householders, or 933 individuals. Within this site alone, 72 individuals present specific vulnerabilities (physical and mental disabilities, unaccompanied minors, pregnancies, elderly, etc.). The procedure to empty the site is pending and expected to occur before the end of this week.
- **Ecole Nationale Dumarsais Estimé:** This site is housing 268 families, or 986 individuals. At least 99 individuals present vulnerabilities similar to those listed above. The procedure to empty the site is pending and expected to occur before the end of this week.
- Lycee Philippe Guerrier: This site was vacated on 8 and 9
 November by the Government. Full registration information
 is however unavailable. Partners Catholic Relief Services
 and Haitian Red Cross have provided financial and material
 to support to the families.



Camp Coordination and Camp Management

- 172 Evacuation shelters have been assessed (profiling) in the South and Grande Anse Departments (99 of which are schools).
- Of those, 53 have been registered. The number of displaced registered is 3,503 Households / 14,988 people. Data entry is ongoing.
- DTM activities continue this week in Beaumont and Dame Marie (Grande Anse) and Baradere (Nippes).
- 48 IOM DTM/registration staff are to be deployed this week as surge support for all DTM-related activities and will work in collaboration with DPC and Haitian Red Cross staff.
- The accompanying dashboard presents a snapshot of current DTM and registration activities as of 9 November.
