IOM's RRTs tested 2,573 individuals and detected 546 positive cases— a test positivity rate of just over 21% in the areas where IOM works. Wider testing results showed a total positivity rate of 38% in Herat during March. New funding is urgently needed to continue this essential service especially as new viral variants of concern enter the country. @IOM, March 2021.



Protection

IOM's Protection programme has supported 878 undocumented returnee households comprising at least one person with specific needs (PSN) in 2021 through provision of timely information, facilitating safe and dignified access to services, and provision of assistance including cash to mitigate identified protection risks and avoid resorting to negative coping mechanisms when referral pathways are exhausted. Migration Health

In 2021, 143,873 patients have been served by IOM's Migration Health Unit in Nimroz, Herat, Kandahar and Nangarhar provinces with basic health care- outpatient consultations, maternal, child and neo-natal health care, reproductive health, family planning and COVID-19 response.

staff at the Herat and Nimroz border points and case workers in 12 provinces of return, the Protection team caseload this week included case management assessments for 40 new PSN households in Faryab, Balkh, Ghor, Nangarhar, Kunduz, Nimroz, Badakhshan. These cases included 16 children at risk, 7 persons with serious medical conditions, 3 women at risk, 2 older persons at risk. 671 PSN individuals (and their households) were identified at Milak and Islam Qala border points by Protection screeners coordination with DoRR. Over the past week, IOM provided the following assistance:

Programming is supported by the UK's FCDO, DG ECHO, CERF, and the United States' Bureau for Population, Refugees and Migration (BPRM).

During the past week a total of 7,926 patients were served by IOM's 7 mobile health teams, inclusive of 3,758 outpatient consultations, health education sessions for 7,926 persons and psychosocial counselling sessions for 1,177 patients.

Under the Global Fund multi-country TB grant in partnership with UNDP, a total of 10,032 undocumented Afghans were screened for tuberculosis at the Zero Point Reception Centres in Herat, Nimroz, Kandahar and Nangarhar. Of the total screened, 278 presumptive TB cases were identified and 2 persons were confirmed positive for TB.

Funding Needs in 2021

In 2021 under the revised Afghanistan Humanitarian Response Plan, IOM is projecting a return of 654,000 undocumented Afghans, 100% of whom will be in need of humanitarian assistance. IOM is seeking 29.7 M USD to ensure continuity of services. As of 30 March, IOM's Cross Border Return Response is only 5% funded with new contributions in 2021 from the Governments of Norway, Japan and Switzerland.

IOM is actively supporting the Ministry of Public Health (MoPH) and WHO in addressing preparedness and emergency response actions through its Cross Border Return, Migration Health and Displacement Tracking Matrix (DTM) Units. Unfortunately the majority of all COVID-19 funding across partners agencies came to a close on 28 February 2021. New funding sources are urgently being sought. On 25 March, IOM launched its new 2021 global COVID-19 appeal— the Strategic Response and Recovery Plan. IOM Afghanistan is seeking 17m USD in 2021 to continue response efforts. The press release for the launch of the SRRP in addition to several relevant documents is available here.

IOM engagement on COVID-19 is primarily focused on the following in Afghanistan:

- 1. Coordination:
- 2. Risk Communication and Community Engagement (RCCE);
- 3. Surveillance/DTM; and
- 4. Points of Entry.

Activities include training for frontline health workers, deployment of staffing to areas of need including placement in health facilities, secondment of staff to cross border surveillance, material support of PPE/equipment, ambulance based referral services and community level awareness raising efforts through health education sessions including within Displacement Tracking Matrix focus group discussions in over 12,600 settlements via a network of more than 72,000 key informants, community leaders and change makers with RCCE and hygiene awareness across all 34 provinces.
