Context Update- Border Closures due to COVID-19

- Given a rapid rise in COVID-19 infections and concerns over the Indian strain of
 the virus, the Government of Pakistan has imposed a 2-week lockdown from 0519 May during which its borders with Iran and Afghanistan will be closed for
 incoming passenger traffic and international flights will be reduced by 80%.
 Commercial movements will be permitted and the return to Afghanistan
 of Afghan nationals inclusive of migrants will be allowed.
- On 29 April, the Government of Iran imposed lockdown measures to stem the spread of COVID-19. The Afghan-Iranian border will be closed but commercial traffic will continue and Afghan nationals will be allowed to return home.

 Pakistan, Iran and Afghanistan are all experiencing limited receipt of vaccination supplies- Pakistan has administered 2.1m doses from a population of over 220m (0.5% of population); Afghanistan has administered 330,000 doses out of 40m persons (0.8%); Iran has administered 1m doses from 80m persons (0.6% of population).



Protection

IOM's Protection programme has supported 1,417 undocumented returnee households (1,860 women, 1,750 men, 2,797 girls and 3,240 boys) with at least one Person with Specific Needs (PSN) in 2021 through provision of timely information, facilitating safe and dignified access to services, and provision of assistance including cash to mitigate identified protection risks and avoid resorting to negative coping mechanisms when referral pathways are exhausted. With screening staff operating at the Herat and Nimroz border points and case workers in 11 provinces of return, the Protection team caseload this week included case management assessments for 154 new PSN households (218 women, 213 men, 347 girls, 384 boys) in Ghor, Nangarhar, Takhar, Herat, Kandahar, Sar-e-Pul, Badakhshan, Faryab, Nimroz, Kabul, and Balkh. These cases included 60 children at risk, 26 persons with serious medical conditions, 18 women at risk, 14 older persons at risk, 13 persons with disability, and 10 single parents. 500 PSN individuals (and their households) were identified at Milak and Islam Qala border points by Protection screeners in coordination with DoRR. 30 undocumented returnee households (21 women,12 men, 18 girls, 20 boys) received Post-arrival support services (e.g. mobile phones, family tracing, and transportation) and 256 PSN cases received cash assistance. Case management assessments were conducted for 154 cases.

Over the past week, IOM provided the following assistance:

Migration Health

In 2021, 166,350 patients have been served by IOM's Migration Health Unit in Nimroz, Herat, Kandahar and Nangarhar provinces with basic health careoutpatient consultations, maternal, child and neo-natal health care, reproductive health, family planning and COVID-19 response. Programming is supported by DG ECHO, CERF. During the past 2 weeks, a total of 6,882 patients were served by IOM's 7 mobile health teams, inclusive of 4,827 outpatient consultations, health education sessions for 6,882 persons and psychosocial counselling sessions for 413 patients. Under the Global Fund multi-country TB grant in partnership with UNDP, a total of 15,698 undocumented Afghans were screened for tuberculosis at the Zero Point Reception Centres in Herat, Nimroz, Kandahar and Nangarhar. Of the total screened, 402 presumptive TB cases were identified and tested and 6 person were confirmed positive.

Cross Border Response Funding Needs in 2021

In 2021 under the revised Afghanistan Humanitarian Response Plan, IOM is projecting a return of 654,000 undocumented Afghans, 100% of whom will be in need of humanitarian assistance. As of late April, return trends suggest a much higher rate of return and total returns in 2021 are likely to significantly exceed the HRP estimation and potentially outpace 2020 as the highest ever return year.

IOM is seeking USD 29.7 M to ensure continuity of services. As of 04 May, IOM's Cross Border Return Response is only 5% funded with new contributions in 2021 from the Governments of Norway,

Japan and Switzerland.

At current levels of funding week on week assistance to returnees is extremely constrained and does not reflect the identified needs of the returning caseload. In addition, failure to receive new funding may result in suspension of cross border return operations as early as July.

IOM is actively supporting the Ministry of Public Health (MoPH) and WHO in addressing preparedness and emergency response actions through its Cross Border Return, Migration Health and Displacement Tracking Matrix (DTM) Units. Unfortunately the majority of all COVID-19 funding across partners agencies came to a close on 28 February 2021. New funding sources are urgently being sought. On 25 March, IOM launched its new 2021 global COVID-19 appeal— the Strategic Response and Recovery Plan. IOM Afghanistan is seeking 17m USD in 2021 to continue response efforts. The press release for the launch of the SRRP in addition to several relevant documents is available here.

IOM engagement on COVID-19 primarily focused following Afghanistan: 1. Coordination; 2. Risk Communication and Community Engagement (RCCE); Activities include training for frontline health workers, deployment of staffing to areas of need including placement in health facilities, secondment of staff to cross border surveillance, material support of PPE/equipment, ambulance based referral services and community level awareness raising efforts through health education sessions including within Displacement Tracking Matrix focus group discussions in over 12,600 settlements via a network of more than 72,000 key informants, community leaders and change makers with RCCE and hygiene awareness across all 34 provinces.
