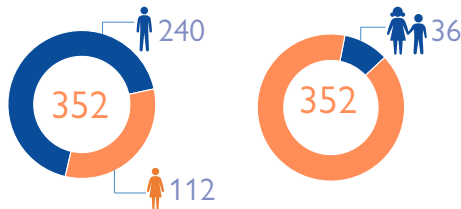

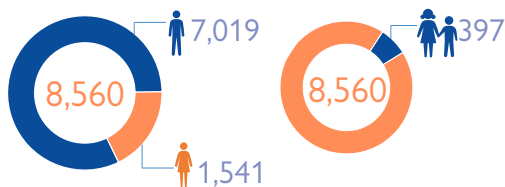

### RETURNS & REINTEGRATION


 **352** Returnees (68% M / 32% F) from non KSA countries benefitted from post-arrival assistance, including orientation and profiling, health screening accommodation and food provision, onward transport assistance, cash grants, psychosocial counselling, economic and social support




 **8,560** Returnees from the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia (KSA) registered and profiled. 397 of 8,560 are UMC




 **504** Vulnerable returnees from KSA assisted with onward transportation allowance (OTA)


 **202** KSA returnees benefitted from NFIs support; clothes, footwear & towels


 **168** Female KSA returnees referred to Penda Manufacturing PLC for job interviews


 **15** UMC assisted with Family Tracing and Reintegration (FTR) support

 **208** Refugees departed Ethiopia for resettlement purposes

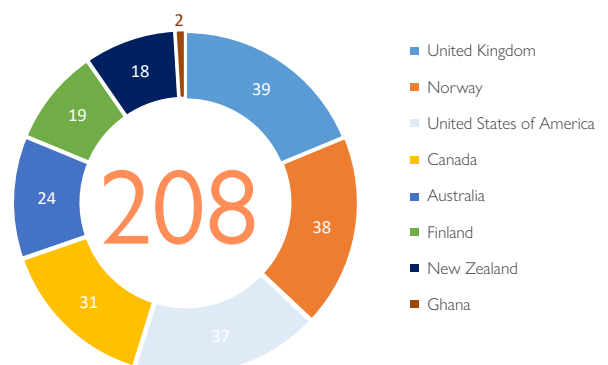
 **663** Refugees were accommodated and assisted at IOM transit centre for interview, medical and departure

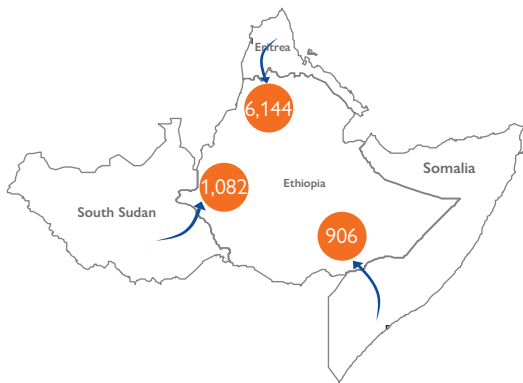

### LABOUR MOBILITY & HUMAN DEVELOPMENT

 **35** TVET instructors benefitted from a 5- day Training of Trainers organized in collaboration with MoLSA and Federal TVET on a revised curriculum and assessment tool on domestic work and care giving fields

 **30** Community actors from West Guji and Gedeo Zones attended a statutory Peace building workshop

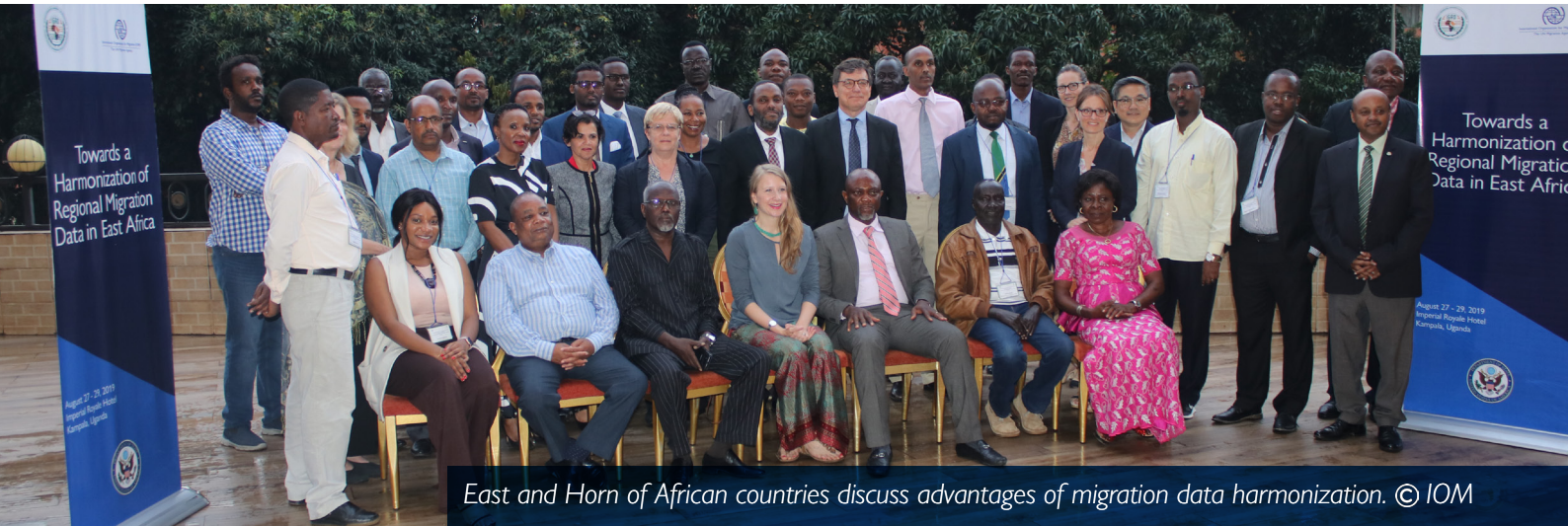
A workshop on mapping of customary conflict resolution institutions was conducted for local government authorities in Somali Regional State

### Ethiopia

**45** Participants, including IOM Ethiopia and government officials from National Statistics Bureaus, immigration services, human trafficking taskforces from Djibouti, Ethiopia, Kenya, Somalia, South Sudan, Sudan, Tanzania Uganda, including representatives from UNECA, AUC, IGAD, GIZ, IOM GMDAC and Statistics Sweden participated in a Regional Migration Data Harmonization Workshop held in Kampala, Uganda under the theme, “Towards Migration Data Harmonization in East Africa”

### Tanzania

**29** Law enforcement, immigration, and social affairs officials and civil society representatives from national and district levels participated in the first national training on identification and protection of vulnerable migrants
