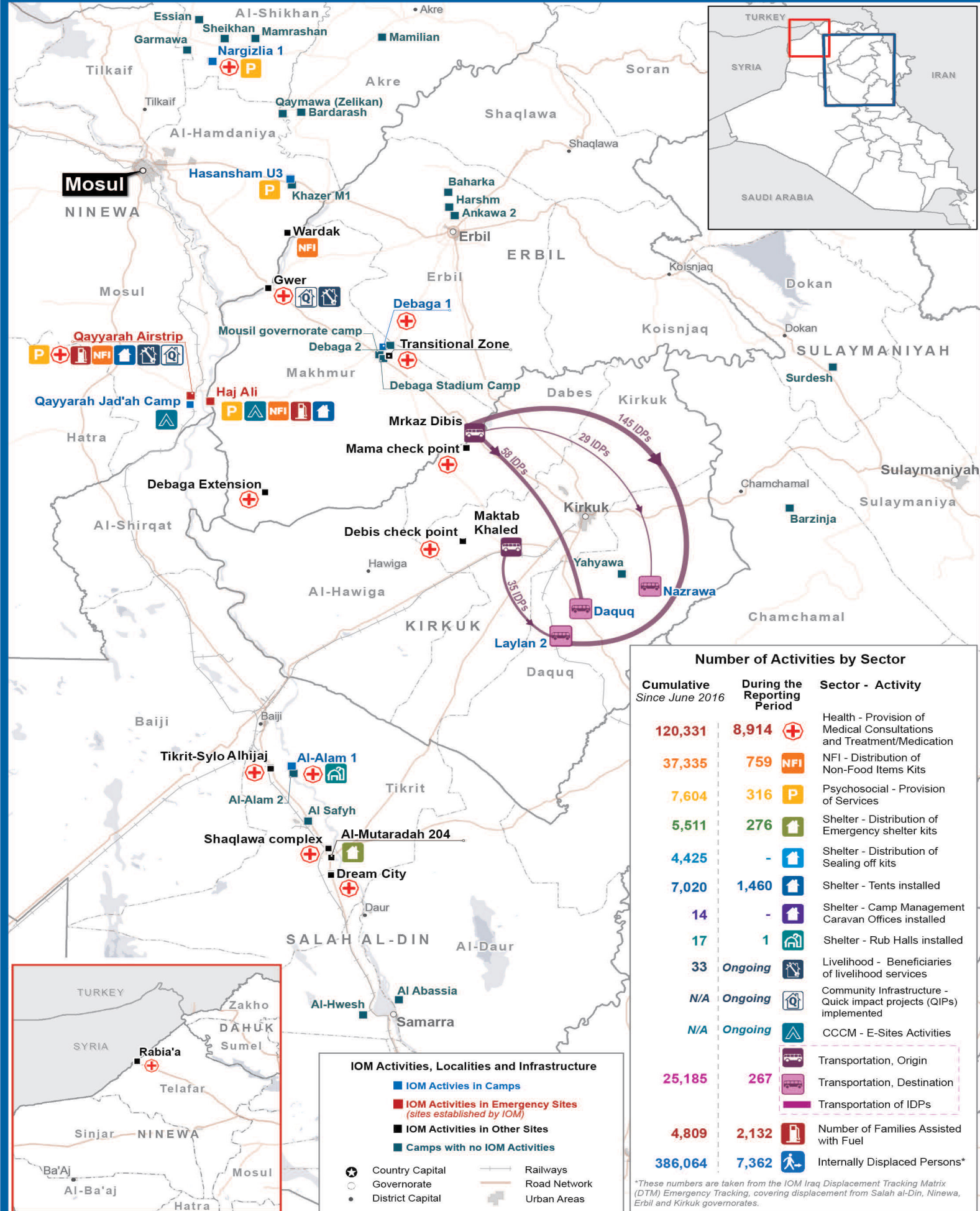

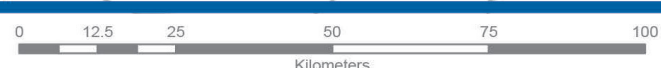

Over the reporting period, 8,914 medical consultations were carried out by IOM in camps and emergency sites in Ninewa and Salah al-Din with the support of a variety of partners.

**As of February 1, 164,178 people were still displaced following military operations to retake ISIL-controlled areas in northern Iraq beginning on October 2016.**

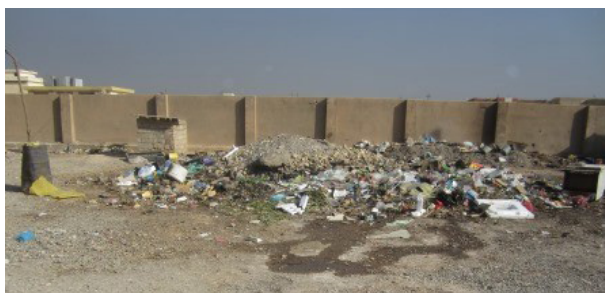
### Stories of displacement: Hussein

“When we first arrived to the school, we found only abandoned walls.” This was the prospect of shelter that Hussein Ali Owda and his family found after fleeing ISIL in their home of Tikrit’s western desert.

They left their home with around 30 other families, bringing only a few clothes with them, and headed towards the school looking for shelter. “It was a very dark night when we came to the school,” added Hussein.

The school had no access to water, electricity, hygiene; it was full of garbage and Hussein and his family had to rely on neighbors to access bathrooms and showers.

With the support of the European Union’s Humanitarian Aid and Civil Protection, IOM has been able to assist the families with a range of initiatives, including providing access to electricity, hot water, water tanks, sanitation, doors, windows and wooden partitions. In addition to site renovations and upgrades, the families have also received blankets, mattresses and heaters.



Left: When Hussein and his family arrived at Al-Anwa’a Al-Jawe’ah School, it was filled with garbage and not fit for human habitation.

Below left and right: After renovations, repairs and upgrades to the school, Hussein, his family, and another 30 families now have more secure, well resourced shelter. The windows have been sealed off, and infrastructure support including electricity, water and hygiene facilities have been installed.
