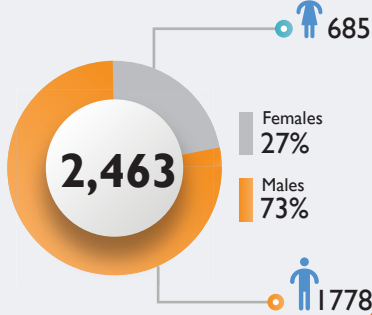
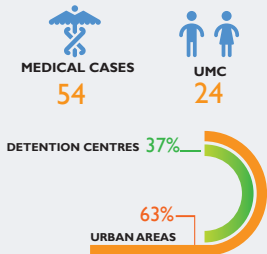

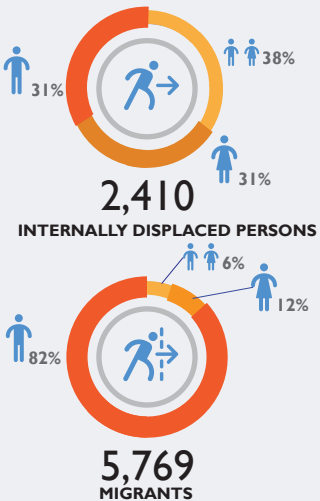
MARITIME UPDATE (SO FAR IN 2019)

SUPPORT TO LIBYAN AND MIGRANT COMMUNITIES

(16-31 MARCH 2019)

- As part of IOM's **Community Stabilization Programme**, the team in Sabha provided support to the Psychosocial Support Association in organizing an event in celebration of the World Water Day. The event was attended by over 100 people from the region, and included a dialogue session on the importance of water, as well as activities for children.
- The **Protection** team continues to conduct regular visits, protection screenings and interviews with migrants in detention centres and in urban areas. So far in 2019, the Protection team supported 66 migrants with alternatives to detention.
- IOM provided generators and security equipment to the Libyan Border Security as part of the **Immigration and Border Management Programme**. The equipment is meant to support in providing safety and security to migrant and local communities in Libya's land borders.
- The **Health** team provided medical assistance to migrants inside and outside detention centres as well as disembarkation points. During the reporting period, over 1,700 internally displaced people and migrants received primary and urgent health assistance.
As part of IOM's continuous support to the Ministry of Health, and in coordination with WHO and UNICEF, 44 staff from health facilities in Derna, Sirte and Um Rzam received a training on the District Health Information System.
- The **Technical Cooperation** team finalized rehabilitation work in Ain Zara, Trig Al Sikka and Karareem detention centres. The team also continues to conduct monitoring and assessment visits to detention centres and disembarkation points in need of rehabilitation.
