




 To date, donors have provided **10.9M USD** (30% of IOM's requirement in 2020) to support IOM's emergency programming under the HRP.





IOM is taking anticipatory action against the Triple Threat in Somalia



MIGRATION, ENVIRONMENT AND CLIMATE CHANGE (MECC)

PROJECT: Identifying climate adaptive solutions to displacement in Somalia

OBJECTIVE: contribute to an enhanced evidence and knowledge base of climate-sensitive, long-term resolution of displacement and increased resilience to climate change in Somalia

PROGRESS: Following the field data collection conducted in Jubbaland and South West State in April and May, an online **validation workshop was held on 18 June 2020** to validate the findings of the field data collection and the data analysis. The validation workshop consisted of participants from the Government, UN and NGOs. During the validation meeting, the research consultants presented the findings and received feedback and recommendations from stakeholders to be incorporated to the final report.

PUBLIC SITE DEVELOPMENT

BUSH CLEARANCE

On 16 September, **bush clearance works for roads, sanitary corridors and drainage** began on the north extension of the Barwaaqo-2 public site in Baidoa. Once complete, the extended site will accommodate **1,009 displaced households** at risk of eviction. This will add to the 1,000 households that have been relocated to the original site in 2019.
