



Travelers were predominately of South Sudanese nationality (82%), whereas 16% are Ugandan nationals. Entrant origin information is self-reported.




WEEKLY COORDINATION NOTES



- IOM attended the National Task Force (NTF) meeting and made a presentation on behalf of the Border Health and Point of Entry (PoE) Technical Working Group as co-lead on 17 January. Key areas of discussion included:
 - 19 operational and 10 future PoE sites to be established across South Sudan by mid-February
- Improvements to the screening process at Juba International Airport, including screening in the VIP lounge and distribution of International Arrival Health Forms (IAHF)
- Three Ebola Treatment Units to be established in Yambio, Yei and Nimule later this month
- IOM attended the Social Mobilization Pillar meeting on 14 January, the State Taskforce coordination meeting on 15 January and the Health Cluster meeting on 18 January in Yei town to plan for the next three months




TOTAL INDIVIDUALS SCREENED FOR EVD SINCE SEPTEMBER 2018

HEALTH UPDATES

- There were 35 fever cases (24 in Tokori, 4 in SSRRC, 6 in Kaya and 1 in Pure) this week. All cases were tested for malaria and treated appropriately
- From 3 to 17 January a field mission in the Yei River area assessed 11 potential PoE screening sites in Morobo, Kajo-Keji and Lainya counties. The operational PoE screening sites at Kaya, Okaba, Pure and Khorijo were also visited and technical support was provided to active screening teams and local healthcare workers

WASH UPDATES

- Community health and hygiene promoters in Kajo-Keji, and Morobo continued to spread
 EVD awareness through educational activities, reaching approximately 2,780 individuals.
 Hygiene promotion teams shared information about handwashing, safe water, food handling and personal hygiene
- Mass EVD awareness campaigns in Khorijo (Kajo-Keji County) reached 1,362 individuals this week
