



IOM MALAKAL RESPONSE UPDATE

28/02/2016

Shelter and CCCM clusters are developing plan and timeline for site rehabilitation, shelter construction and relocation. Community members to be involved in planning and design.

30,085 individuals
7,521 households

Currently residing in the old PoCs



Over 20 MT of critical humanitarian supplies arrived thus far by IOM chartered planes.



POC 3 + roads	3,929 individuals 982 HH
POC 4	4,805 individuals 1,201 HH

CCCM

IOM DTM has provided replacements for 1,217 registration cards that were lost/ damaged.
IOM DTM is supporting GFD in Malakal Town.

Health

IOM is providing 350 consultations a day.
Malaria and diarrhea are top morbidities.
Antenatal and postnatal care on-going.
Health education and promotion reaching 2,800 persons/day. Messages include malaria prevention, hygiene, disease prevention and child immunization.

SECTOR 1

Some presence of IDPs
1,447 shelters were burnt
Two water tanks (5,000 liter) damaged by the fire beyond repair
IMC clinic was looted
Most of the latrines are damaged but repairable

POC 2	9,842 individuals 2,461 HH
POC 1	5,471 individuals 1,368 HH

WASH

IOM is providing 14 liters/person/day of safe water to IDPs.
Additional water towers erected to improve pressure at water points in Sector 1.
Construction of latrines to serve the IOM clinic in PoC 1 ongoing.
Hygiene promoters working in the old PoCs maintain, clean and ensure access to all sanitation facilities.

Shelter

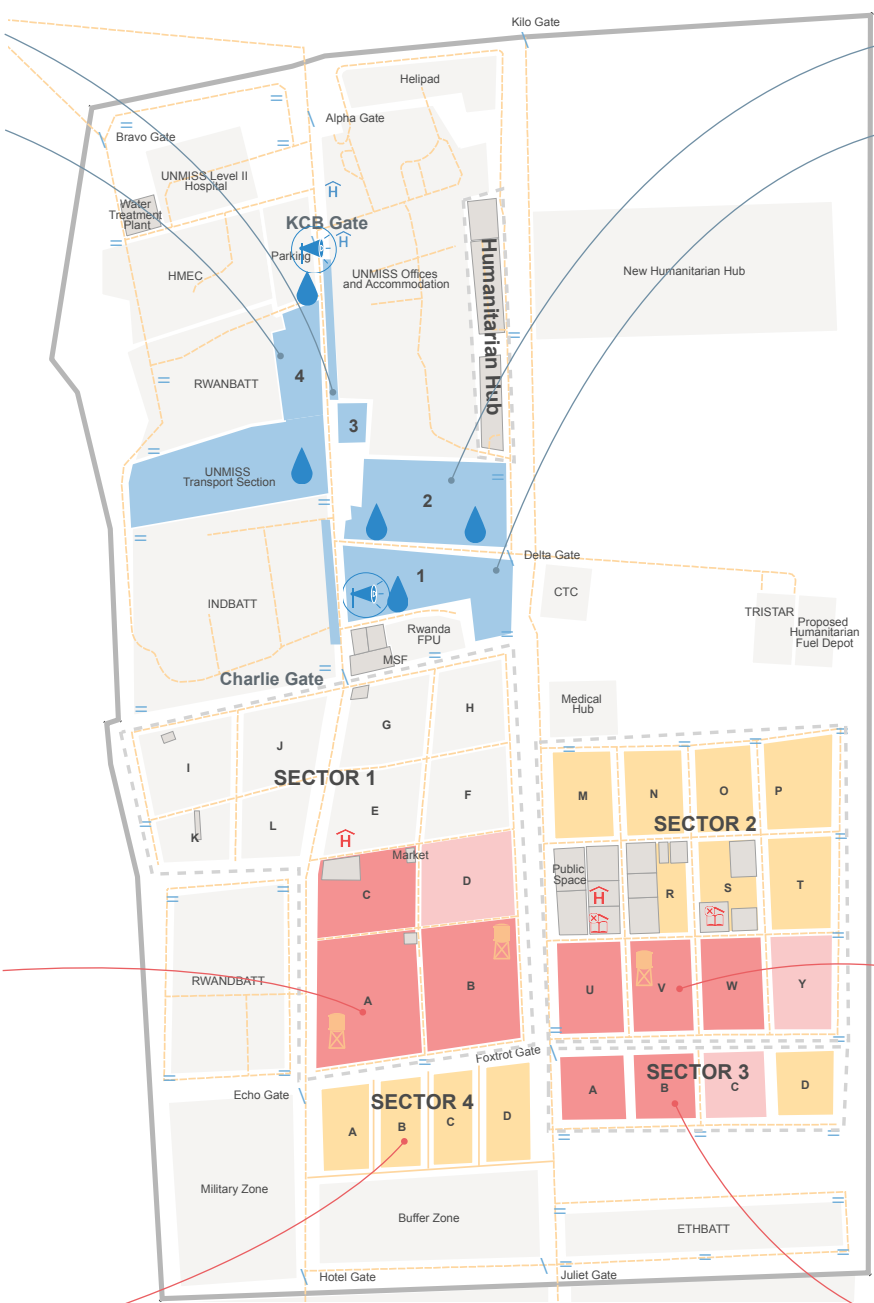
IOM S/NFI team is assisting in the distribution of shade netting (1,471 households), blankets, mosquito nets and sleeping mats.
Following assessment, S/NFI distribution under consideration for IDPs in Malakal Town.

SECTOR 2

Deserted
785 shelters were burnt
IOM primary health clinic was destroyed
One water tank (70,000 liter) damaged but repairable
One school destroyed, one school damaged

SECTOR 3

Deserted
94 shelters were burnt

No damage

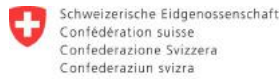
- Areas where IDPs have moved (Old PoC 1,2,3,4)
