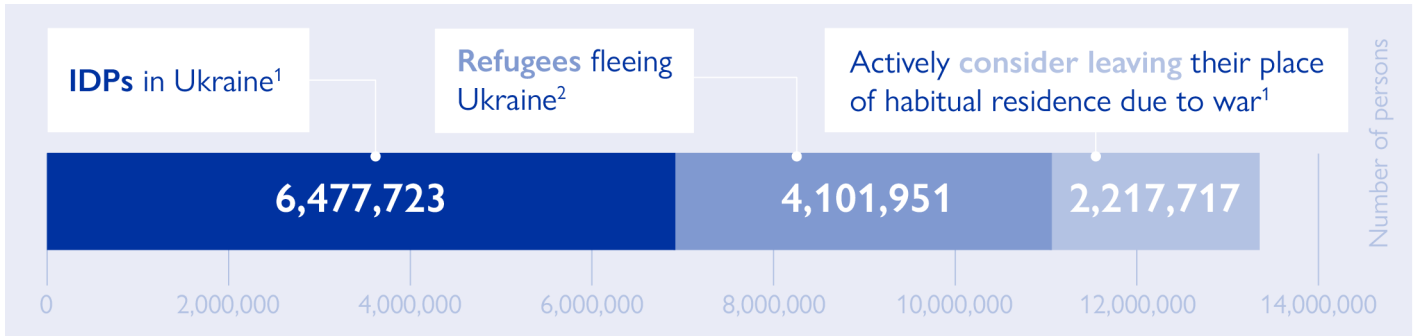

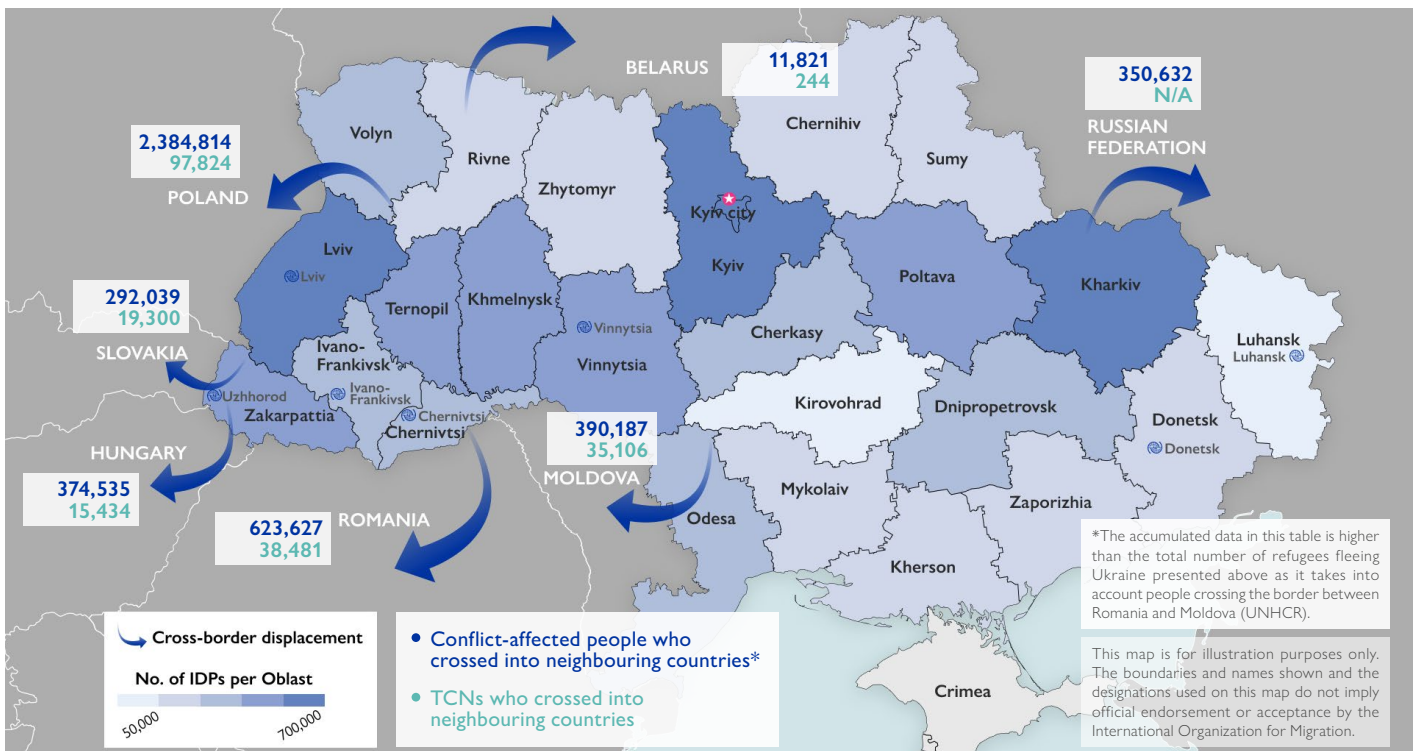

IOM Ukraine currently has more than 300 staff in various locations. Since 24 February 2022, it has established presence in Uzhhorod, Lviv, Chernivtsi, Ivano-Frankivsk and Vinnytsia, in addition to its pre-existing field offices in Donetsk and Luhansk.

Warehouses have been set up in Uzhhorod, Berehove, Lviv, Chernivtsi, and Ivano Ivano-Frankivsk in Ukraine, as well as in Košice, Slovakia. IOM also avails itself of the Logistics Cluster's services, especially in Rzeszow (Poland), Lviv and Dnipro.

RECENT RESPONSE

	On 16 March, IOM published the findings of a nation-wide representative survey on displacement and movement intentions, estimating 6.48 million internally displaced persons and an additional 2.2 million people who considered leaving their place of residence.
	IOM distributed 8,800 hygiene kits in Zaporizhia, Zakarpattia and Dnipropetrovsk regions since the last update. More deliveries, including to Chernihiv, are being organized.
	Since the last update, more than 7,000 thermal blankets have been distributed in Lviv, Ivano-Frankivsk, Mykolaiv, Khmelnytsky and Dnipropetrovsk regions. This brings the total to 18,375.
	More than 40,000 metric tons of humanitarian goods are currently in IOM's pipeline and the first 20 of 600 trucks have already reached IOM warehouses with shelter and WASH NFIs. Most of these items will be distributed in heavily conflict-affected areas.

	Targeted food assistance is being provided for certain isolated areas in Luhansk and Donetsk GCA. Furthermore, almost two millions high energy biscuits have reached warehouses in Lviv and will be shipped to Odesa in partnership with Save the Children, targeting children and pregnant/lactating mothers in line with the Nutrition Cluster guidelines.
	On Shelter response, IOM is supporting local civil society organizations and authorities in Luhansk Region GCA with the procurement of construction materials for emergency repairs. Local procurement is prioritized in the interest of supporting the economy in the affected areas.
	IOM has started rolling out cash-based interventions . Enrolment is progressing in various regions and a large component for 40,000 individuals was already launched in Zakarpattia, where IOM is closely cooperating with the authorities and supporting them with registration. A first payment to over 400 individuals is ready to be issued and 1,500 are being validated.
	Tailored in-kind assistance and psychosocial support /psychological first aid was provided to 2,310 IDPs and other crisis-affected populations who were at heightened protection risks and faced barriers to access humanitarian assistance in different parts of the country. 80% of these beneficiaries were children.
	IOM continues its assessments of displacement sites to inform its interventions and improve the privacy and dignity of displaced persons. 30 collective centers in Zakarpattia Region have been assessed to date. Temporary shelter options are being discussed with the local authorities in key displacement areas. IOM is looking at alternatives to camp settings, with special attention to the installation of modular houses.
	IOM is providing support through information, assistance and advocacy to third-country nationals in Ukraine as well as to foreign nationals with family members in the country. To date, such support has been extended to more than 3,000 individuals.
	IOM continues to support the State Border Guard Service (SBGS) and State Customs Service (SCS) of Ukraine through the provision of priority equipment essential for facilitating safe cross border movements of persons and goods including humanitarian cargo at the western borders. This includes 35 diesel generators with 5kW capacity and two with 200kW capacity have been delivered to the SCS.
	A wide range of awareness raising materials related to safe migration, the prevention of trafficking in persons, MHPSS and the EU temporary protection directive are continuously disseminated through local and central authorities, IOM's channels, at BCPs and during the provision of humanitarian assistance. More than 165,000 leaflets have been distributed to date.

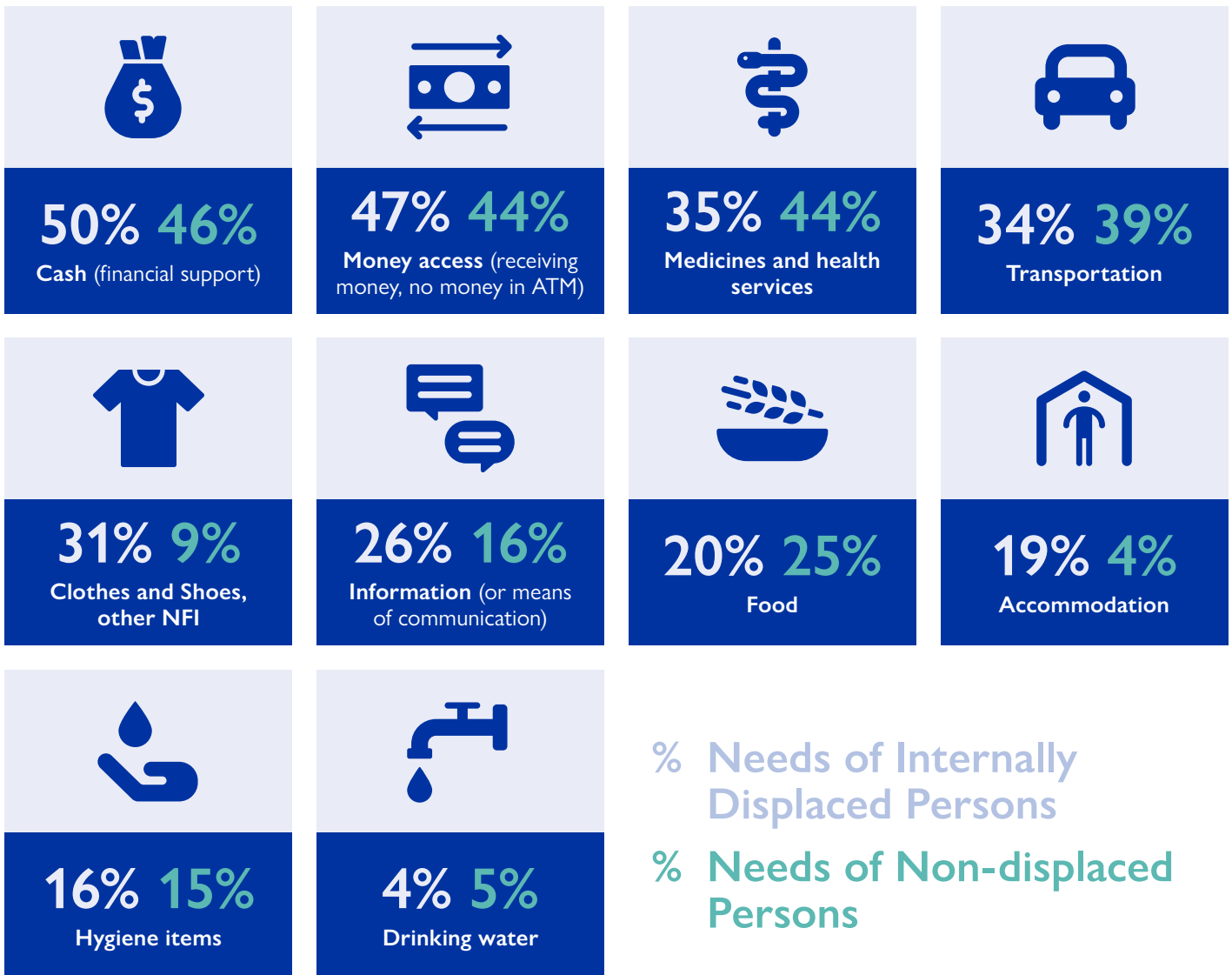
