





Since 24 February 2022, IOM has established presence in Uzhhorod, Lviv, Chernivtsi, Ivano-Frankivsk and Vinnytsia, in addition to its pre-existing field offices in Donetsk and Luhansk and its office in Kyiv.

Warehouses have been set up in Uzhhorod, Berehove, Lviv, Chernivtsi, and Ivano-Frankivsk in Ukraine, as well as in Košice, Slovakia. IOM also avails itself of the Logistics Cluster's services, especially in Rzeszow (Poland), Lviv and Dnipro.



RECENT RESPONSE



Large quantities of items continue to arrive via IOM's multi-donor **NFI pipeline** and the logistics network in Ukraine and in neighbouring countries. Thanks to this pipeline and a network of currently 30 IPs, IOM can reach all regions with the exception of Crimea.



Over 316,000 non-food items have reached IOM's beneficiaries or are set to be distributed across 20 different oblasts. In the past week, this included the distribution of items such as hygiene kits, water containers, mattresses, blankets and kitchen sets.



IOM has published its fourth **Ukraine Internal Displacement Report** on 9 May. According to a nationwide representative survey on displacement and movement intentions, an estimated total of 8.03 million people are internally displaced in Ukraine.



64,000 individuals have so far benefitted from IOM's multi-donor Multi-purpose Cash (MPC) Programme, which is currently covering several regions in Western Ukraine. As registrations continue, IOM is planning to extend the geographical coverage to several Eastern regions and is considering other cash-based interventions.



More than 7,700 beneficiaries have been reached to date with **food kits** from IOM's field office in **Donetsk** city. Distributions, including in hard-to-reach areas, are continuing. IOM also delivered food kits in the GCA and 2 million high-energy biscuits to Odesa Region.



Two mobile shelter teams have been deployed in Uzhhorod, Zakarpattia Region, and are conducting light and small-scale repairs to collective centres. This approach will be scaled up and replicated in other regions, where Vinnytsia, Lviv and Ivano-Frankivsk regions are planned to be covered in a second phase.



IOM's support to collective centres furthermore includes minor WASH-related improvements to some centres identified in coordination with the local authorities and detailed assessments of WASH needs in Zakarpattia Region, planned solid waste and desludging services for areas outside Uzhhorod hosting large IDP populations, and the upcoming installation of water treatment units in collective centres in Vinnytsia to help improve the water quality.



To respond to the acute medical needs in the country, IOM is scaling up its health response. This includes the operation of four mobile clinics in Lviv Region, where several hundred patients have received medical and psychological consultations in the past two weeks, as well as the provision of specialized medical devices to facilities in Mykolaiv Region. An expansion to Eastern Regions is being prepared in close coordination with local partners.



General and specialized protection assistance has been provided to more than 6,600 crisis-affected people, more than 60% of them children, in 18 regions of Ukraine since 24 February. This included access to health-care and psychosocial support, access to documentation, tailored in-kind support or appropriate housing or shelter access.



IOM continues its awareness raising efforts in the digital and television space, as well as through in-person leaflet distribution and info sessions. Together with the Delegation of the European Union to Ukraine, IOM has launched a nationwide trafficking prevention information campaign, which is being distributed through national TV and radio channels, social networks, as well as outdoor advertisements promoting IOM's 527 Migrant Advice and Counter-Trafficking Hotline. The campaign has reached more than a million Ukrainians in its first days. In addition, approximately 10,000 awareness-raising leaflets have been distributed in the last ten days, bringing the total to more than a quarter million.




