




Since 24 February 2022, IOM has established presence in Uzhhorod, Lviv, Chernivtsi, Ivano-Frankivsk and Vinnytsia, in addition to its pre-existing field offices in Donetsk and Luhansk.

Warehouses have been set up in Uzhhorod, Berehove, Lviv, Chernivtsi, and Ivano-Frankivsk in Ukraine, as well as in Košice, Slovakia. IOM also avails itself of the Logistics Cluster's services, especially in Rzeszow (Poland), Lviv and Dnipro.

## RECENT RESPONSE



Large quantities of humanitarian goods continue to arrive as part of IOM's pipeline of more than 50,000 metric tons. They are delivered through a network of 12 IOM warehouses in addition to those operated by the Logistics Cluster.



In addition, IOM receives large in-kind donations from governments and partner organizations. Last week, a second delivery of 8 tons of humanitarian aid (clothes, blankets and toys) donated by Pompiers de l'Urgence Internationale was received as part of IOM's cross-border operations from Moldova to Odesa Region.



IOM has to date signed agreements with 29 implementing partners, complementing the reach of its operational hubs. This allows IOM to operate in all regions of Ukraine with the exception of Crimea and includes activities in the non-government-controlled areas (NGCA) of Luhansk and Donetsk regions.



IOM has published its third Ukraine Internal Displacement Report on 21 April. According to a nationwide representative survey on displacement and movement intentions, an estimated total of 7.71 million **people** are internally displaced in Ukraine.



IOM's Cash-Based Intervention programming in Zakarpattia Region is currently reaching 15,000 individuals with multi-purpose cash transfers. This is being scaled up in a total of five pilot regions as more people are being registered. Furthermore, IOM is exploring options to best support people who were forced to return to their habitual place of residence after depleting their funds.



IOM continues to distribute a wide range of non-food items directly to beneficiaries and to its IPs in different regions of Ukraine. Over the last ten days, this included 10,132 blankets, 10,425 kitchen sets, 1,450 water containers, 13,764 matrasses, 3,527 hygiene kits and 1,800 solar lamps.



In addition, 200 10-liter water containers as well as containers of up to 500 liters have been provided to institutions hosting and supporting crisis-affected populations in Western Ukraine. IDP shelters in Ivano-Frankivsk Region have furthermore received 16 washing and drying machines.



In Zakarpattia Region, 140 collective centres currently housing approximately 8,300 persons have been assessed. IOM's planned response includes the provision of much-needed items as a short-term solution, as well as infrastructure upgrades/renovations of some collective centers and capacity building on site management to local authorities and partners.



IOM provides direct assistance to people with **protection needs**. To date, 4,115 crisis-affected people have been supported, out of which 69% were children. The provided support included access to health-care and psychosocial support, access to documentation, tailored in-kind support or appropriate housing or shelter



As part of its efforts to support the ongoing activities of the State Customs Service of Ukraine (SCS), IOM has recently delivered two 150kW diesel generators to the SCS in Volyn Region. This assistance ensures uninterrupted vital operations in times of power outages and facilitates the safe and smooth cross border movement of goods and persons.



IOM awareness raising activities related to safe migration, the mitigation of risks of trafficking in persons, gender-based violence, MHPSS and the EU temporary protection directive are ongoing. As part of these efforts, approximately 44,000 leaflets have been distributed in the last ten days, bringing the total to more than 230,000.
