


UKRAINE RESPONSE SITUATION REPORT



Since 24 February 2022, IOM has established presence in Uzhhorod, Lviv, Chernivtsi, Ivano-Frankivsk and Vinnytsia, in addition to its pre-existing field offices in Donetsk and Luhansk and its office in Warehouses have been set up in Uzhhorod, Berehove, Lviv,

Chernivtsi, and Ivano-Frankivsk in Ukraine, as well as in Košice, Slovakia. IOM also avails itself of the Logistics Cluster's services, especially in Rzeszow (Poland), Lviv and Dnipro.

RESPONSE



Through IOM's multi-donor Non-Food Items (NFI) pipeline, approximately 50,000 metric tons of goods are being delivered to Ukraine. Thanks to this pipeline and a network of currently 30 implementing partners, IOM can reach all regions with the exception of Crimea.



Over 160,000 non-food items have reached IOM's beneficiaries or are set to be distributed across 16 different oblasts. In recent days, this included the distribution of items such as hygiene kits, water containers, mattresses, blankets and kitchen sets.



Large in-kind donations have so far been received from the United States, Canada, the UK and from Pompiers de l'Urgence Internationale. Items continue to arrive via plane or truck and are transported through IOM's logistics network, notably its warehouse in Košice, Slovakia.



IOM multi-donor multi-purpose cash programme has reached 25,000 individuals and is being further rolled out across 5 pilot regions. Registrations continue and the geographical coverage will be expanded.



4,800 people were reached with distribution of various food kits from IOM's field office in Donetsk city. The second round, aiming to distribute 8,600 food kits, will start soon. IOM also delivered food kits in the Government-controlled areas (GCA) and 2 million high-energy biscuits to Odesa region.



As part of its Camp Coordination and Camp Management (CCCM) and shelter programme, IOM has assessed 240 collective centers in Zakarpattia Region. These centers were hosting more than 15,400 people and have a capacity of 22,350. The most urgent needs in these center are kitchen equipment, WASH repairs, washing/drying machines, food and hygiene items. In addition to providing much-needed items, IOM will prioritize infrastructure upgrades/renovation and capacity building efforts.



IOM is scaling up its our **health presence** in Ukraine to respond to the needs of IDPs and conflict-affected populations and reduce the burden on the health system. IOM has partnered with one major hospital in Lviv to provide four mobile clinics and more mobile teams are planned in two other oblasts.



IOM provides direct assistance to people with **protection** needs. To date, more than 5,000 crisis-affected people have been supported, out of which 69% were children. The provided support included access to health care and psychosocial support, access to documentation, tailored in-kind support or appropriate housing or shelter access.



Awareness raising efforts related to safe migration, the mitigation of risks of trafficking in persons, genderbased violence, mental health and psychosocial support (MHPSS) and the EU temporary protection directive continue. As part of these activities, approximately 12,000 leaflets have been distributed in the last ten days, bringing the total to more than 242,000.




