


UKRAINE RESPONSE SITUATION REPORT



Since 24 February 2022, IOM has established presence in Uzhhorod, Lviv, Chernivtsi, Ivano-Frankivsk and Vinnytsia, in addition to its pre-existing field offices in Donetsk and Luhansk and its office in Kyiv.

Warehouses have been set up in Uzhhorod, Berehove, Lviv, Chernivtsi, and Ivano-Frankivsk in Ukraine, as well as in Košice, Slovakia. IOM also avails itself of the Logistics Cluster's services, especially in Rzeszow (Poland), Lviv and Dnipro.

RECENT RESPONSE



461,000 NFIs have been distributed to beneficiaries or are expected to arrive soon. This includes almost 50,000 items that have been added to the pipeline since last week and are now on their way to Ukraine. NFIs have so far been distributed to 22 different regions through a combination of IOM's direct implementation capacity and more than 30 implementing partners.



IOM has published its fifth <u>Ukraine Internal Displacement Report</u> on 30 May. According to a nationwide representative survey on displacement and movement intentions, an estimated total of 7.13 million people are internally displaced in Ukraine. This constitutes an observed reduction of 11% compared to the last round. The report also delivers a closer look at the income and employment situation among IDPs.



In coordination with the oblast authorities, IOM has conducted WASH assessments in Vinnytsia municipality in the past week and installed three water treatment units with a total capacity of 6,000 litres per day in selected collective centres. Furthermore, household hygiene kits and top-up kits have been distributed in two collective centres. In Ivano-Frankivsk, four water tanks have been installed in social canteens and a boarding school. In addition, 4,800 IDPs residing in collective centres in Zaporizhia Region were reached with needed hygiene kits.



IOM continues the distribution of food kits through its office in Donetsk. Almost 5,000 people have been reached recently in one week alone. The kits have been distributed in hard-to-reach areas affected by hostilities, including in Mariupol and Volnovakha.



IOM's mobile clinics continue to provide primary health-care services and MHPSS consultations in Lviv Region. More than 3,100 people have been reached so far across 67 locations. In an interest to further strengthen the medical response, IOM has signed agreements with new partners and continues discussions with others.



A total of 1,050 IDPs have so far benefitted from the **shelter rehabilitation** works IOM is carrying out in collective centres in Zakarpattia Region, including through its mobile repair teams. While the mobile repair teams for light works are being expanded, IOM has also opened tenders for light to heavy rehabilitation works at twenty-seven collective centres in different regions.



IOM distributed NFIs, including hygiene kits, lockable containers, and garbage bins in 26 collective centres in Uzhhorod city. These centres were also supported with care and maintenance activities to improve site conditions. IOM has also launched a multisectoral assessment in collective centres in Dnipro on 15 May and preliminary findings show that the top three most reported priority needs are beds, mattresses, and bedding items; washing and drying machines; and kitchen sets and utensils.



IOM, together with its implementing partner, provided a briefing on human trafficking trends, risks, gaps and recommendations to the US Congress. The provision of general and specialized protection assistance continues - more than 1,900 crisis-affected people have been supported in the past week, bringing the total to 10,390. IOM's Medical Rehabilitation Center in Kyiv has recently re-opened and assists crisis-affected populations who experienced exploitation, GBV, trafficking or severe human rights violations.




