Since 24 February 2022, IOM has established presence in Uzhhorod, Lviv, Chernivtsi, Ivano-Frankivsk and Vinnytsia, in addition to its pre-existing field offices in Donetsk and Luhansk and its office in Kyiv.

Warehouses have been set up in Uzhhorod, Berehove, Lviv, Chernivtsi, and Ivano-Frankivsk in Ukraine, as well as in Košice, Slovakia. IOM also avails itself of the Logistics Cluster's services, especially in Rzeszow (Poland), Lviv and Dnipro.

RECENT RESPONSE



A total of **619,000 NFIs** have been distributed to beneficiaries or are expected to arrive soon. This includes more than 150,000 items that have been added to the pipeline since last week and are now on their way to Ukraine. NFIs have so far been distributed to 24 different oblasts through a combination of IOM's direct implementation capacity and more than 30 implementing partners.



IOM is finalizing a comprehensive **WASH** intervention, including the rehabilitation of showers, toilets and sewage systems, in Uzhhorod, Zakarpattia Region. To explore the WASH needs in different accommodation facilities and prepare for further interventions, eleven assessments were carried out in Zakarpattia, Dnipropetrovsk and Ivano-Frankivsk regions in the past week. 138 much-needed washing and drying machines for collective centres have been delivered to the local authorities in Vinnytsia and Khmelnytskyi regions.

	<p>During the past week, light shelter repair works have been completed in schools in Chernivtsi Region, with additional repairs by IOM's mobile teams ongoing in collective centres in Vinnytsia. In preparation for further interventions, technical assessments were carried out in more than 20 centres across Chernivtsi, Ivano-Frankivsk, Vinnytsia, Khmelnytskyi and Lviv regions. Shelter-related distributions of items such as cots, blankets and kitchen sets took place in Lviv Region.</p>
	<p>IOM has to date assessed more than 200 collective centres in Dnipro through implementing partners. This is in addition to assessments that are taking place in Kryvyi Rih and Ivano-Frankivsk. The results of these assessments and the identified gaps will play a critical role in informing IOM's response.</p>
	<p>In the course of the past week, IOM's mobile clinics visited 10 locations in Lviv Region, reaching 1,284 persons with primary health-care services and psychosocial consultations. These services will soon expand to Dnipropetrovsk and Poltava. IOM teams in Ukraine, Moldova and Poland are also actively participating in the TRANSMED initiative to help with the transportation and support of vulnerable medical cases to EU countries.</p>
	<p>The majority of IOM's protection activities at the level of the territorial communities have resumed and were adapted to community hubs, whose protection-oriented services can be accessed by both IDPs and host communities. The provision of general and specialized protection assistance continues – more than 10,850 crisis-affected people have been supported since 24 February. An ongoing digital awareness-raising campaign on fraudulent schemes with protection risks, held on Facebook, has already reached approximately 3.7 million users.</p>

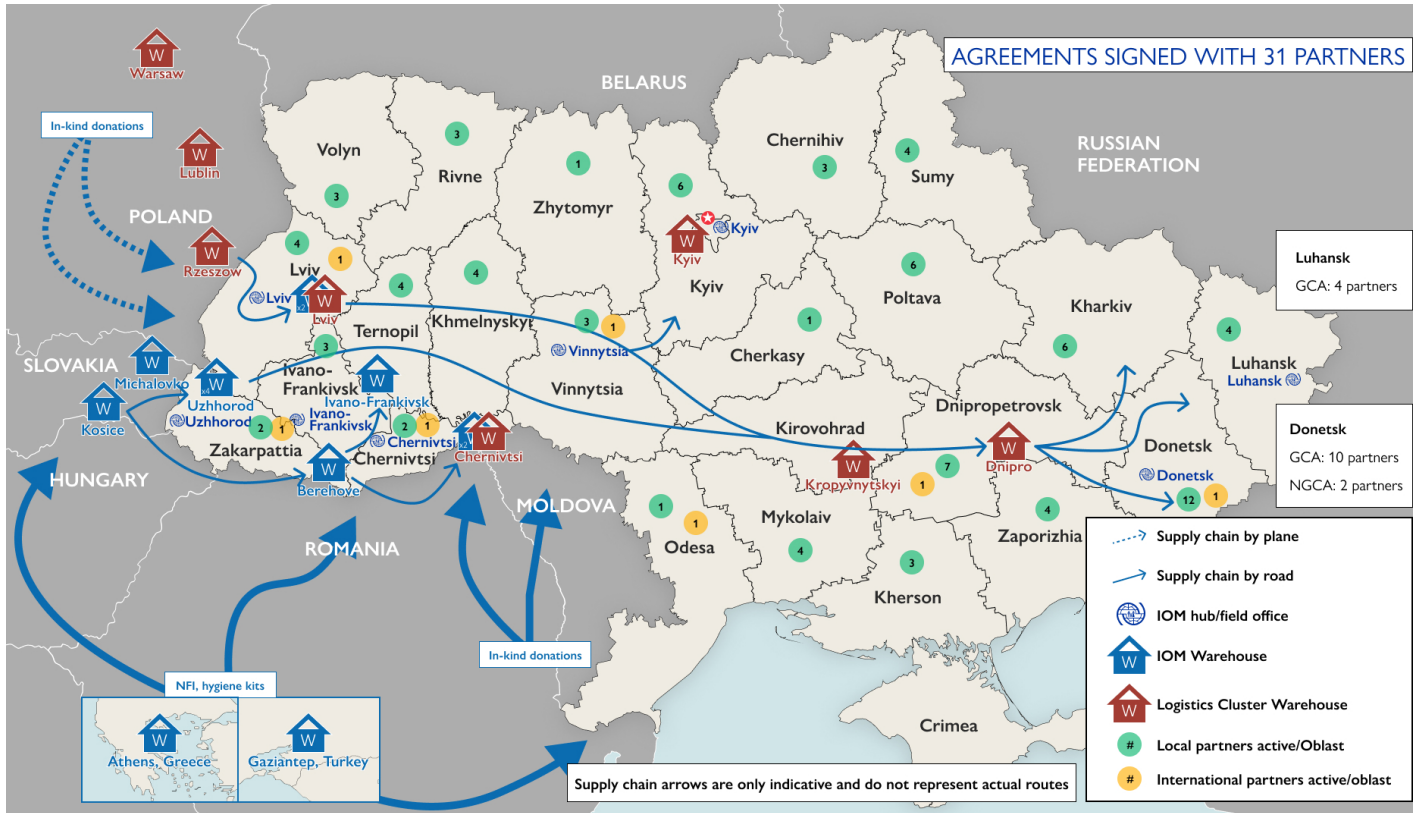
