



Highlights

■ On 11 August, 252 Ethiopian migrants were evacuated by boat from Al Hudaydah (Yemen) to Obock (Djibouti). Around 800 migrants are receiving food, water, and medical care on a daily basis from IOM staff in Al Hudaydah.

■ IOM installed 15 water tanks in Al Dhale'e city in anticipation of the mass return of IDPs expected in Al Dhale'e governorate.

■ As of 13 August, over 57,500 people arrived in Djibouti, Somalia, Ethiopia and Sudan. Nearly 21,000 have received post-arrival assistance from IOM teams.

Situation Overview

Hostilities and airstrikes continue in Aden, Lahj, Al Dhale'e, Shabwa, and Marib, Sa'ada, Hajjah and Al Hudaydah governorates.

Civilians continue to bear the brunt of the on-going violence in Yemen, with conflict posing grave risks to their safety and psychosocial well-being. Today 21.1 million people - or four out of five inhabitants - need humanitarian assistance. Around 1.3 million people have been displaced inside Yemen.

Migrants continue to arrive in Al Hudaydah from other areas in Yemen. Around 800 migrants are receiving food, water, and medical care on a daily basis from IOM staff. Despite the ongoing crisis, IOM and partners' informal reports indicate that since 26 March, an average of 150 migrants are crossing Djibouti on a daily basis to reach Yemen and 1,321 Yemeni nationals have returned by boat from Djibouti to Yemen since 1 April.

IOM activities are supported by the generous contributions by the United States, the European Commission - Humanitarian Aid & Civil Protection, Germany, Japan, the United Kingdom, Czech Republic, Republic of Korea, CERF, UNHCR, and OCHA. Total contributions amount to USD 14 million (17% of total funding requirements).

IOM RESPONSE

HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES IN YEMEN

NFI, Shelter and WASH

Aden

In the past week, IOM continued providing 20,000 to 36,000 liters of water daily to Alwehda Hospital in Ash Sheikh Outhman. Additionally, IOM rehabilitated the water network of Al Mayadeen Health Center in Crater (partially run by MSF), mainly replacing water pipes and taps.

In anticipation of mass return of IDPs to Aden, 15 water tanks are being distributed in Khur Maksar and Attawahi districts. Fourteen of these water tanks will serve as additional community water sites benefiting 800 households (5,600 individuals). The remaining water tank will be installed in a health unit in Attawahi. Moreover, IOM is looking into the possibility of distributing returnee assistance kits or shelter rehabilitation tool kits to IDPs returning to Aden.

Abyan

IOM provides regular water trucking services to 1,362 IDP households hosted in 45 schools in Lawder, Zinjubar and Khanfir districts. IOM is also providing water to 12 schools in Khanfir hosting IDPs, and to water points in Al Makhzan Al Sharqi and Al Makhzan Al Gharbi areas, reaching around 940 IDP households.

Al Dhale'e

Similar to Aden, in anticipation of the mass return of IDPs to Al Dhale'e, IOM installed 15 water tanks in Al Dhale'e city. These water tanks will serve approximately 800 households (5,600 individuals).

Health

Aden

IDPs hosted in schools in Al Mansoorah and Ash Sheikh Outhman districts, and Inma City are benefitting from IOM's

health assistance through the treatment of diseases and injuries, provision of reproductive health care, as well as health promotion. A total of 649 medical cases (205 women, 100 men, 186 girls, and 158 boys) were treated between 6 and 12 August. In addition, two severe acute malnutrition (SAM) cases and two moderate acute malnutrition (MAM) cases were treated in Ash Sheikh Outhman district.

Four IOM staff in Aden (one the head of survey and three physicians as team leaders) are participating in an inter-agency Standardized Monitoring and Assessment for Relief and Transition (SMART) survey which will continue until 23 August.

Abyan

Support to Al-Razi Hospital continues this week with 43 cases treated by IOM health staff.

Sana'a

IDPs continue to receive primary health care, and mental health and psychosocial support in Sana'a. Between 6 and 12 August, 145 medical cases (41 women, 24 men, 60 girls, and 20 boys) were provided with health care assistance.

Al Hudaydah

During the past week, IOM provided healthcare to 469 IDPs (142 women, 115 men, 105 girls, and 107 boys).

Assistance to Migrants in Yemen

Migrants continue to arrive in Al Hudaydah from other areas in Yemen. In the past week, IOM screened 293 new arrivals in Al Hudaydah for vulnerabilities, as well as evaluated their

health, immediate food and water needs. Additionally, IOM provided 24 Ethiopian nationals (7 men and 17 boys) with health care assistance.

Around 800 migrants remain in Al Hudaydah and are receiving food, water, and medical care on a daily basis from IOM staff.

EVACUATION OUT OF YEMEN

On 11 August, 252 Ethiopian migrants were evacuated by boat from Al Hudaydah to Obock, Djibouti, bringing the total number of individuals evacuated by IOM-chartered boats to 1,665 Ethiopians across nine boat rotations.

ARRIVALS FROM YEMEN TO THE HORN OF AFRICA

To date, 57,574 people have arrived in Djibouti, Somalia, Sudan, and Ethiopia from Yemen.

Arrivals in Djibouti

As of 12 August, 22,807 persons have arrived in Djibouti from Yemen including 1,839 Djiboutian nationals, 10,402 Yemenis, and 10,566 TCNs.

On 12 August, 252 Ethiopian migrants evacuated from Al Hudaydah arrived at the port of Obock. They are currently hosted at the Migrant Response Centre (MRC) and are also receiving food, NFIs, and medical assistance. In the following days, the newly arrived Ethiopian nationals will be documented by the Embassy of the Federal Republic of Ethiopia prior to being provided with Onward Transportation Assistance (OTA) to return to Ethiopia.

Arrivals in Somalia

To date, 28,596 individuals (90% Somalis, 9% Yemenis, and 1% TCNs) have arrived in Somalia. Of the 28,596 arrivals, IOM provided 7,843 people with OTA from Bosaso and Berbera to their areas of origin.

Puntland: Between 6 and 12 August, 13 Somali nationals fleeing the conflict in Yemen arrived in Bosaso. To date, Bosaso has received a total of 19,233 arrivals. Since April, IOM has provided 2,712 individuals with OTA in Bosaso including 32 TCNs.

From 16 to 18 August, IOM will train Puntland immigration officials in registration of people arriving from Yemen. The training aims to ensure that necessary data about all arrivals will be systematically captured and that proof of entry is given to everyone without exception; proof of entry

is important for determining eligibility for further reintegration assistance. Moreover, IOM has procured laptops, printers, necessary furniture and registration equipment and a handover ceremony is scheduled to take place on 19 August once the training has been completed.

Somaliland: In the past week, one boat arrived in Berbera carrying a total of 131 passengers (120 Somalis, 10 Yemenis and one Ethiopian), bringing the total number of arrivals to Somaliland to 9,006 individuals. Following fitness-to-travel screenings, 121 individuals were provided with OTA to return to Baidoa, Belet Hawa, Marka and Mogadishu with the vast majority (80 people) indicating Mogadishu as their final destination. IOM also arranged travel documents and transportation for one Ethiopian national to Jigjiga where further assistance is provided by IOM in Ethiopia. Cumulatively, IOM has assisted 5,131 arrivals with OTA from Somaliland, including 68 TCNs.

In Berbera, the IOM medical team treated 72 patients (23 women, 27 men and 22 children), including five pregnancy cases; one patient was referred to the Berbera hospital. A total of 2,366 arrivals have benefitted from IOM's health services in Somaliland, including 39 individuals who were referred to local hospitals.

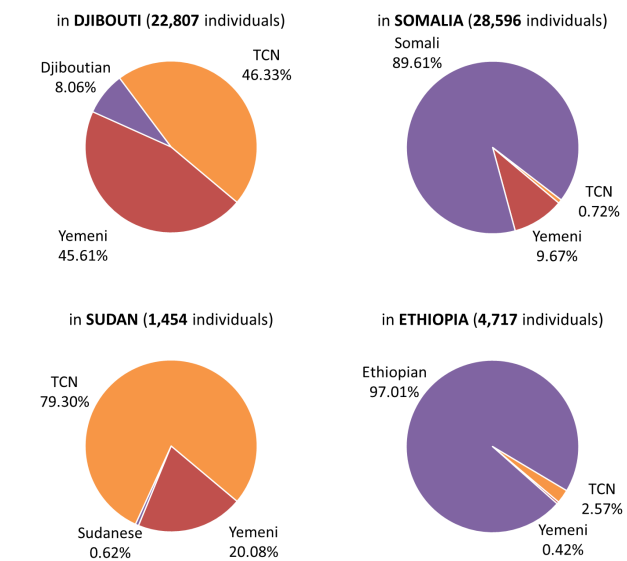

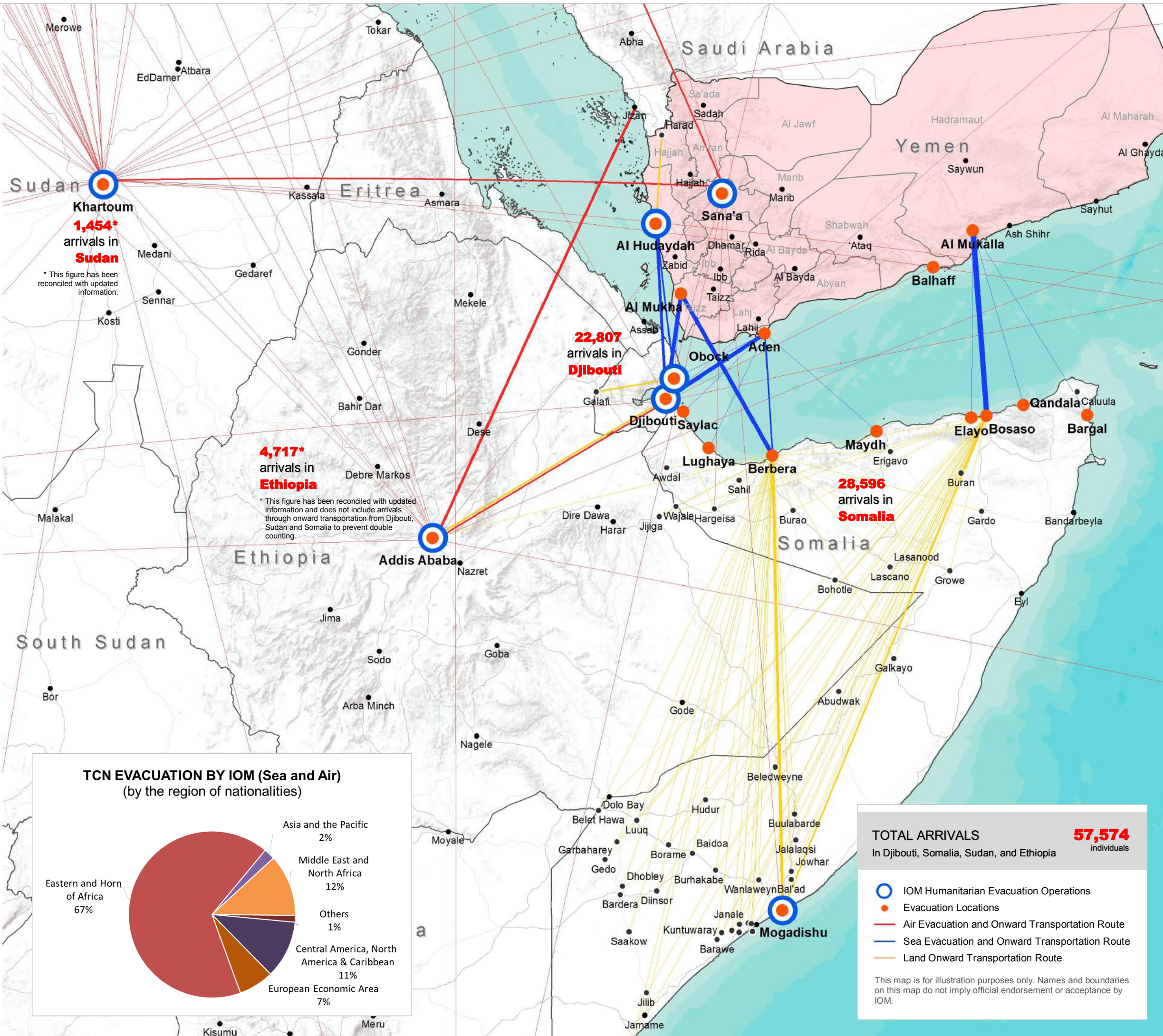
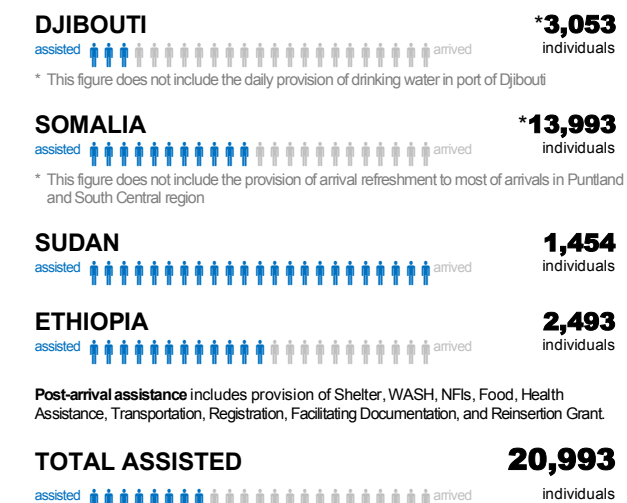

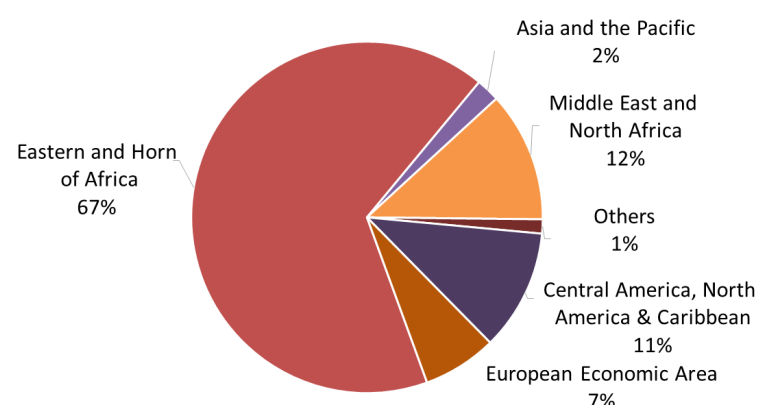
